## Never Give Up!

Biographers have written that Thomas Edison, the inventor of the light bulb, made over nine hundred light bulbs that didn't work before he finally made one that did. Nine hundred times he went to all the trouble of making a light bulb, plugging it in, flipping the switch, and watching while nothing happened. People must have thought he was nuts, but he kept on trying. According to Edison, every time he made a light bulb that didn't work, he merely found "one more way not to make a light bulb." Eventually, by the process of elimination, he made a light bulb that produced light. As a result, he is known as one of the greatest inventors of all time.

Most of us don't realize how many failures successful people endure before they achieve their purposes. We only hear about the one time they succeed. What made Edison great was his commitment to making a light bulb. He didn't let his failures discourage him. He hung in there and kept trying, even though he kept messing up.



So it is with the Christian life. Most Christians we look up to, failed many times before arriving where they are today. The apostle Paul admitted as much in Romans 7. "*I mess up all the time!*" he moaned. "*The things I want to do, I don't do, and vice versa.*" But Paul kept on running the race, striving to reach his goal, the finish line. (Philippians 3:14.) He never gave up. That's commitment.

Being committed doesn't mean you are successful all the time. It means you hang in there. You keep on making mistakes. Like Edison, you learn from your mistakes one more way not to live the Christian life. Most of us don't realize how many failures successful people endure before they achieve their purposes. We only hear about the one time they succeed. What made Edison great was his commitment to making a light bulb. He didn't let his failures discourage him. He hung in there and kept trying, even though he kept messing up.

## ***The Penny Gospel Has Arrived!!!***

**The Vision** of the Penny Gospel is to share the story of Jesus with thousands of people across Scotland and the 2014 Commonwealth Games present a unique opportunity for Scotland's churches to do something simple but significant in their community.

### **Our Challenge**

The Church Leadership saw this as a great outreach opportunity to place a gospel in every house in Lossiemouth. St James are joining us with this and Jenny Adams of the Church of Scotland will be distributing to Hopeman and Burghead.

### **So, what is the Penny Gospel?**

The Penny Gospel is a special edition of Luke's Gospel with inspiring stories of sporting men and women who believe their faith is worth More Than Gold. It's priced at a minimum of 1p (though we and the other churches have agreed to at least double that) allowing churches to order multiple copies and give thousands of them away in the run up and during the Commonwealth Games (£10 = 1,000 copies). It's a tool to help Christians share their faith, pass on the Word of God to others and has the potential to change many people's lives.

### **How does this involve you?**

5,500 copies were ordered and have now been delivered – all that needs to be done now is to distribute them to every house in Lossiemouth. Leonora Paterson has agreed to co-ordinate this for LBC and will be sorting out the areas that we shall be delivering to. Then comes your part – we shall be looking for people to volunteer to help with the distribution of these Gospels – the more volunteers the fewer houses that each person will need to deliver to.

This is a great outreach opportunity, and we would ask that you prayerfully consider your response when the request for volunteers is asked for. The date is yet to be agreed but it will be in the next few weeks.

## **Matt Payne, Church Worker-Update**

As you were reading last month's magazine I was at Spring Harvest and what a week it was! I worked as part of the Energize team with fellow DNAers which is led by Doug and Belinda Horley. Our team looked after the 8-11 age group for 5 hours in the morning and 3 at night for 5 days. We played many games and did lots of activities but what impacted me the most was the level at which we taught the kids and how much God wanted to minister into their lives. I have never seen God move so much in kids' work. We had 400 kids who God poured His Spirit into and many got pictures, visions and the gift of tongues from God.

The following weeks after Spring Harvest I had trips to London and Aberdeen for DNA. We spent time planning our mission trips and taking on roles which are needed. Our teaching sessions have been on law and grace, leadership, confrontation, gospel evangelism, the Trinity, Christology, Mark's Gospel and sacraments. We have spent some time out doing evangelism on the streets. I love this and am looking forward to doing more in June.

Next week I will be heading to Ehrenfriedersdorf in Germany as part of a team from DNA. There we will be doing kids/youth work, Street works, running events, leading services, and anything else the church wants. I can't wait to get out there and see God use us as a team and grow us in our gifts even more. DNA has been amazing so far at pushing me in every area and they continue to do this. Only God knows where the limit is. I never imagined I would have achieved so much this year but with God nothing is impossible even if I have a long way to go.

Work at the church has been great. Most of my time has been spent running YF and Area 4:12 where we have been looking at the life of Jesus.

Preparation for our visit to GLIA in Dorohoi, Romania is well underway. Thank you to all who have helped with the Beetle Drive, Praise Night service and the Soup and Sweet Lunch. Not only did we raise lots of money (the total so far is £1600), the events were great times of fun, fellowship and evangelism. I'm working on other fundraising ideas which will hopefully come together to help the team with the trip costs.

Dads' and Lads' football is going great. We get a good 30 lads every week which is more than enough for indoor football. We get great opportunities to chat with the Lads and it's so evident that they need Christ in their lives. The sad thing is that they are far from accepting it. Please pray for them and our witness in this ministry.

Many of the young people have had exams over the last month. Please pray for them and their future and that they will be following God's will. It's always sad to see members of the youth leaving for uni and other adventures but as always more come up from primary school and the work continues.

Thanks to Carol Jack who came to speak with the teenagers about her time in Malawi. It's great for them to hear about how God uses and guides us.

I love working for the Church but at times I find it tough trying to juggle DNA, work at Phillip's and family life. Seeing God move in people's lives keeps me going though and reminds me that my life's not about me but all for Him.

Thank you to everyone for their continued encouragement and support. God has provided and blessed me in so many ways this year and I have seen so many answers to prayer.

Please pray for me as I consider how and where God wants me to serve after August.
